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Racing Economic Indicators Post Strong Close to 2011

While overall handle (wagering) for 2011 was down versus 2010, the year ended on an upbeat note. The year-over-year increase in U.S. wagering from December 2011 — when compared to December 2010 — represented the first increase since February 2008 (46 months ago). Figures for the fourth quarter of 2011 surpassed those for the fourth quarter of 2010 — with wagering up 1.37%, race days up 4.40% and purses up 10%. The last quarter to show an increase for wagering occurred during the third quarter of 2007 (17 quarters ago), when wagering was up .68% when compared to the third quarter of 2006.

For the year 2011, U.S. purses experienced a 2.89% increase when compared to 2010. The last yearly upturn for purses occurred in 2007, when the increase was 3.63% over 2006. As horse owners, we all welcome the rise in purses.

Two-Year-Olds in Training Sales off to a Good Start in 2012

Both the OBS March Select Sale and initial Fasig-Tipton sale of the season saw rises in both average and median prices for two-year-olds in training. It appears the desire for quality horses remains and participation in the sport continues to be robust. Fasig-Tipton Texas will conduct its two-year-olds in training sale this week at Lone Star Park.
